EVENT RULES

This race shall be conducted under Cycling New Zealand's Road and Track Rules

CONDITIONS	Riders must have a current licence.
MANAGEMENT	Riders must complete each stage to be eligible to start the following stage.
	The Tour Director reserves the right to exercise discretion in cases of
	misdirection, crashes, and mechanical trouble.
	The Chief Commissaire reserves the right to combine fields.
	Riders must present 10 minutes prior to their start time.
EQUIPMENT	Wheels must have a minimum of 16 spokes and rims a maximum of 55mm
RESTRICTIONS	deep (excludes U19 Men & U19 Women – but no disc wheels for time trial).
	The same bike must be used throughout the tour.
	Any rider found to have an irregular bike after racing may be disqualified
	from the tour.
NUMBERS	Two numbers are to be worn at all times.
	One on the left-hand side and one over the right lower back pocket. There
	is an additional seat number.
COMMUNICATIONS	No race radios (referring to communications between the riders and team
	management) will not be permitted in the Yunca Tour of Southland
	Riders and supporters are responsible for monitoring any updates via the North Faceback page and through the sound system.

ROAD BEHAVIOUR	All roads on the Tour are open.
	Riders must take strict notice of road patrols and traffic regulations.
	On open roads, riders must keep left at all times. Riders who cross the
	centre line may be subject to sanctions.
	Riders crossing the centre of the road on a yellow (no overtaking) line may
	be sanctioned and may be disqualified.
	 No earpieces are to be worn (e.g., iPods, MP3s, speaker, communications).
	Bad language will not be tolerated.
	Riders may not be given refreshments, other than that which they carry
	themselves. There is no feeding from the side of the road or from
	vehicles.

RUBBISH	All supporters and riders are to ensure rubbish is placed in bins. Please
	respect the various properties we use throughout the event by leaving it in

STAGE FINISHES,	All stage finishes will be indicated by a chequered flag, a white line marker
SPRINTS & MOUNTAIN PRIMES	across the road and cones on either side of the road.
WIOUNTAIN PRIVIES	Mountain Primes will be indicated by an orange cone with an orange flag
	on the side of the road.

	Riders are not to re-cross the finish line after completing their stage
INCIDENTS	In the case of a duly noted incident (fall, mechanical problem, puncture) in
INCIDENTS	the last three kilometres of a road race stage, the rider or riders affected
	shall be credited with the time of the rider or riders in whose company
	they were riding at the moment of the incident. Their placing shall be
	determined by the order in which he or they actually cross the finishing

SUPPORT VEHICLES	Under no circumstances are support vehicles permitted to follow the race.

 Times will be taken in seconds only, so that a group of riders in a close bunch will be credited with the same time.

ROAD RACING RULES

FOLLOWING VEHICLES	 Vehicles (apart from official vehicles) are not permitted to follow riders on the course.
BREAKDOWN ASSISTANCE	 Riders may receive breakdown assistance from the neutral assistance vehicle. Spare wheels are to be delivered to the neutral support vehicle designated and collected after the stage finish. Whatever the position of a rider in the race, the rider may receive such assistance only at the rear of the bunch, on the left shoulder of the road. Persons riding in neutral vehicle shall not reach or lean out. While support teams will endeavour at all times to provide coverage for all riders, there may be times during the event where support is not immediately available. It is recommended that you carry a spare tube and pump. Ensure all wheels are clearly labelled with name, grade, race number and type e.g., Shimano, disc, and rim breaks. Wheels are submitted to neutral support on the understanding that they are available for all riders to use, unless otherwise stated. For Stage 1 (Time Trial) & Stage 2 (Kermesse) service is from the designated pit area. No free laps permitted within the Kermesse. For Stage 6 (Street Race) service is from the designated pit area. Riders permitted up to 1 lap out for service (unless within the last 2 laps). Riders involved in an incident must re-join the race in the group they were in
	prior to the incident.
TIME BONUSES	 There are no time bonuses on the finish line.
ABL SPRINT ACE CLASSIFICATION	 No Sprint Ace points for Time Trial. No Sprint Jersey for U13 B/G Sprint points are 3, 2 and 1. At the conclusion of the Tour, should riders be equal on points, their placings on final stage will serve as a tie breaker not GC placing. Sprint points are only allocated at designated Sprint points. Leader of the Sprint Ace classification must wear the jersey.
INVERCARGILL AIRPORT MOUNTAIN CLASSIFICATION	 No Mountain points for Time Trial, Kermesse or Stage 6. No Mountain Jersey for U13 B/G Leader of the Mountain classification must wear the jersey. Mountain points are as follows: Stage 3 Stage 4 3, 2 and 1 Stage 5 3, 2 and 1



 All riders in a given bunch shall be credited with the same time when they cross the finishing line.
 Groups will be separated when there is a clear gap of 1 second between riders.
All times will be rounded down to the nearest second.
 If the final result is a tie, the winner shall be determined by adding the
fractions of seconds from the individual time trial.
In the case of a duly noted fall, puncture or mechanical incident within 3km
of a road race finish, the rider or riders involved shall be credited with the
time of the rider or riders in whose company they were riding at the moment of the accident.
 The rider's placing shall be determined by the order in which the rider actually crosses the finishing line.
The Tour Director or Commissaires may issue a general warning to all riders at the start line briefing.
Once a warning is issued, either as a general warning or to an individual, a
further infringement may result in Time penalties, Fines, Disqualification, or
any combination of the above.
 Protests must be lodged within 20 minutes of a stage finish. These are to be written on the form provided and must be accompanied with the \$100 fee.
 Cycling Southland has made every endeavour to ensure that areas of traffic control around the race provide for a safe event. The procedures in this Event Manual are to be adhered to by all involved with the Yunca Tour of Southland, including riders, officials, media, and support teams. It is the rider's responsibility to ensure that they conduct themselves in a safe manner to avoid causing danger to themselves and fellow competitors. It is also the rider's responsibility to attend all pre-stage briefings which are held ten minutes before the allocated start time. It is the rider's responsibility to ensure that they have signed in as required. All accidents and incidents must be reported to the Health & Safety Officer and an accident form completed.



INDIVIDUAL TIME TRIAL RULES

Riders are not per	mitted to warm up on the course, once the Time Trials have commenced.
EQUIPMENT	 No disc wheels and no aero bars are allowed.
	No fixed wheel bikes permitted.
	Riders must always maintain a firm grip on the handlebars when racing.
	The same bike is required to be ridden throughout the whole Yunca Junior
	Tour except if permission has been given from a commissaire due to a
	breakage to the bike.
	 A NZ/AUS approved helmet must be worn in all stages.
	Aero helmets are NOT permitted for the Time Trial.
	Time Trial Bikes are NOT permitted.
STARTING ORDER	Each rider shall present no later than 10 minutes before the time set for the
	rider's start, after which the rider must stay within the start area.
	The rider shall be supported by the designated holder.
	Time penalties shall be applied if riders break the start early.
	The time of any rider reporting late at the start shall be calculated from the
	rider's scheduled starting time and the rider shall make a standing start
	from the place designated for that purpose.
	The start of any rider reporting late shall not adversely affect the start of a
	competitor making a start at their allotted time.
	The starter will ensure sufficient gap between such riders.
START TIMES	Start times are indicative. Organisers reserve the right to alter start times.
	It is the responsibility of the rider to monitor programme changes.
RACING	If one rider is caught up by another, that rider may neither lead nor follow
PROCEDURE	in the slipstream of the rider who caught up.
	A rider, upon catching up with another, shall leave a lateral gap of at least
	two metres between himself and the other rider.
	Riders may not help one another unless in an accident or emergency.
	Riders are to be aware of riders starting and finishing.



TRANSPONDERS

- Transponders must be attached to the front left fork of your bike.
- After you complete the final stage at Yunca, please make sure you return your transponder to the race headquarters.
- Those who fail to return or lose their transponder will be faced with a \$150 replacement fee.

MEDICAL SUPPORT

- First Aid will be on site at all stages at the start/finish area.
- Please report any accidents to officials at the finish line.
- Any rider withdrawing from the event, please contact the timekeepers at the finish line and hand your transponder in.

- The school is situated approximately 50km out of Invercargill. Please allow enough time for travel.

- There will be access to carparking on the school field.
- Please respect the school property and ensure all rubbish is taken away.








STAGE 2 – TERETONGA KERMESSE






